Northeast Wisconsin Technical College, 2740 W. Mason Street. From U.S. Hwy. 41, take the Hwy. 54/Mason Street exit and drive west on Mason Street for about two miles.

The N.E.W. Clinic at NWTC is in NWTC's Health Sciences Center. (See HS on the map below.) Follow the N.E.W. Clinic signs to the "Health and Dental Clinics" entrance.

Parking is always free and open to the public.

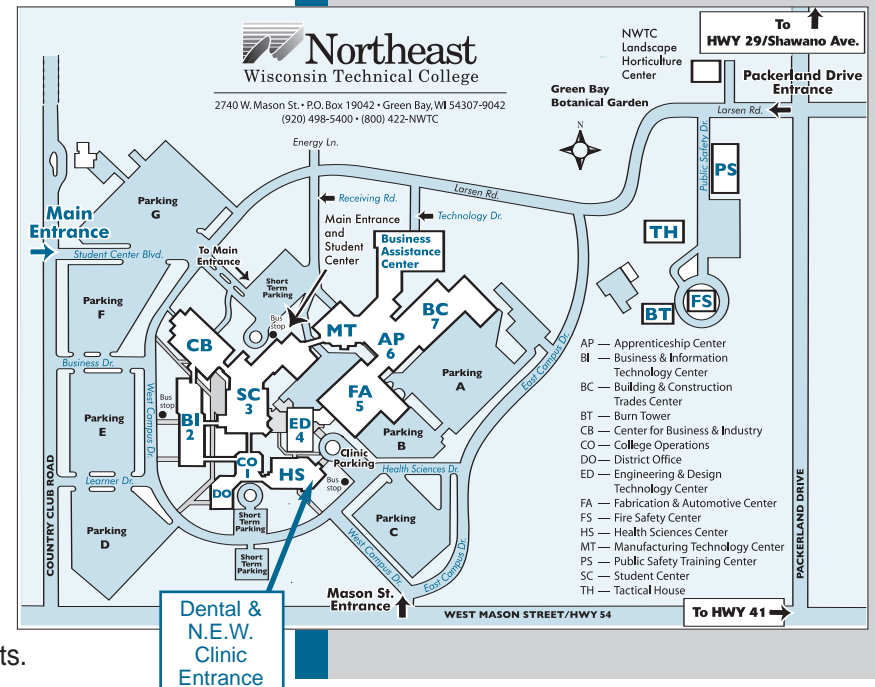
